PRICES TO INCLUDE

PART 1 - GENERAL

Any work shown on the plans or required in the specifications but not paid for separately as a bid item shall be included in the cost of other bid items. The amount bid for each Bid Item shall include the following:

- 1.1 All labor, materials, tools, equipment, and transportation necessary for the proper execution of the work in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- 1.2 All assistance required by the Engineer to verify compliance with the Contract Documents, including measuring for final pay quantities.
- 1.3 Project coordination and scheduling.
- 1.4 Detailed breakdown of lump sum bid items as requested by the Engineer.
- 1.5 All provisions necessary to protect workmen, the general public, and property along the work in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- 1.6 Protection and/or replacement of existing property corner monuments.
- 1.7 Record drawings of the locations of all installed or repaired underground utilities, including water mains and service connections, storm sewer and drainpipes, electrical conduit, sewers, tees, wyes, laterals, etc.
- 1.8 Materials testing.
- 1.9 Reimbursement to Owner for costs of re-inspection or re-testing of any work not installed in compliance with the Contract Documents.
- 1.10 The unit price for surface courses placed on new intermediate courses shall include the cost of tack coat.
- 1.11 Construction staking of the improvements
- 1.12 Potholing near residences at 6811, and 6817 Home & Garage on Colleen Drive within the work area to confirm depths and location of existing footers/foundations, and the preparation of a zone of influence diagram for OWNER review prior to excavation for sewer improvements.

PART 2 - ITEMS

All work proposed by this contract shall be quantified and paid for in accordance with the pertinent O.D.O.T. specification except as specifically altered by other provisions of this contract.

2.1 PRECONSTRUCTION VIDEO DOCUMENTATION, AS PER PLAN

Basis of Payment

The lump sum price shall include all costs associated with hiring a professional videography firm to document in detail the existing conditions of the entire work area and potential disturbed areas and submitting a high-quality USB Flash Drive with audio commentary and video log.

2.2 CLEARING & GRUBBING, AS PER PLAN

Basis of Payment

The lump sum price shall be in accordance with ODOT Item 201 and shall include tree removal from the work area.

2.3 BONDS AND INSURANCES, AS PER PLAN

Basis of Payment

A "Bonds and Insurances" item (including "Owner/Contractor Protective Policy," "All Risk Builder's Risk Insurance," and/or "Installation Floater Insurance", and/or endorsements to fully comply with all contract requirements) has been included in the bid proposal.

2.4 TEMPORARY SEDIMENT & EROSION CONTROL, AS PER PLAN

Basis of Payment

The lump sum price shall include all labor, equipment, and materials including but not limited to straw bales, silt fence, check dams, and temporary seeding to provide sediment and erosion control commensurate with the Contractor's means, methods, work schedule, and in accordance with plan details and specifications, if any. The lump sum price shall also include contractor development of a Stormwater Pollution Prevent Plan (SWPPP) that complies with all County and State rules and regulations, along with all necessary permitting, fees, review, and approvals as necessary.

2.5 PIPE REMOVED, 24 INCH AND UNDER, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The method of measurement shall be as per ODOT 202.

Basis of Payment

The basis of payment shall be as per ODOT 202 with the following additions: The unit price shall be irrespective of the depth of pipe and shall include field exploration/potholing of the existing 12-& 15-inch storm sewer depths and inverts to the triple barrel sewer to determine existing invert of the sewers before removal to confirm connection depths required to connect to the new junction chamber.

2.6 CATCH BASIN OR INLET REMOVED, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid is based upon the number of catch basins removed in accordance with the plans.

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall include the removal and proper disposal of existing storm inlet basin structure from the project work area, in conformance with ODOT Item 202 and the price shall include furnishing of all labor, materials, tools necessary to complete the work. The price shall be irrespective of the depth of the structure and if not called out as a separate pay item shall include; exploratory excavation, and verification of existing utilities prior to removal of structure; earth and/or rock excavation; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess material, all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; bedding; compacted granular backfill; compacted backfill material; specials; couplings, seals, bends; tees; fittings; jointing material; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, fences, or other appurtenances; temporary pavement; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.7 STORM SEWER ABANDONED, GROUT FILLED, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

Measurement shall be per foot (FT) in accordance with ODOT Item 202 where indicated on the plans. This work shall include all bulk-heading, caps, and venting required to accomplish a properly grout-filled pipe, free of air voids.

Basis of Payment

Payment shall be made per foot (FT) in accordance with ODOT Item 202.

2.8 27 INCH – 36 INCH STORM SEWER HEAVY CLEANING, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number of linear feet cleaned per the specifications measured centerline to centerline of manholes or inlets, or to outfalls.

Basis of Payment

The unit prices for the various sizes of pipes shall include furnishing water, cleaning equipment, root removal, the complete removal and disposal of debris as per NASSCO guidelines for heavy cleaning of sewers. This item shall include pre and post cleaning CCTV per NASSCO guidelines. Any section that is reviewed by the Engineer and determined to not be completing cleaned shall be recleaned and televised at no additional cost to the Owner.

2.9 36 INCH JOINT SEWER SEALING, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be for each individual joint as noted by inner diameter pipe size. The measured diameter of the pipe may vary as much 2-4 inches in either direction in some locations due to deformation of the pipe. No additional payment will be made for these variations and the pipe will be considered a 36" pipe within this noted variation range. Any difference found outside this range may be considered a changed condition.

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall be irrespective of the depth of pipe and location of joint between manholes; equipment, tools, materials, and personal necessary to preform OSHA permitted confined spaced entries; all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; equipment and material required to fill sinkholes from the surface above pipe joints; the replacement of poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, fences, landscape timbers, guardrail, sign wiring, fixtures, or other appurtenances; site cleanup; cutting of excess material after curing; removal, hauling, and disposing of excess joint sealant to an approved waste facility; pre and post construction video of each segment of sewer in accordance with NASSCO PACP guidelines including identifying joint locations for above ground insertion points; photo/video documentation of joints prior to construction, during injection, after curing, and after restoration of pipe and ground surface; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown

2.10 TYPE "C" PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT (ASPHALT), ROADWAY, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The method of measurement shall be as per ODOT 253 or 255 as applicable with the exception that lengths used for calculation of each individual repair area shall not exceed the maximum pay length indicated on the drawings.

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Basis of Payment

The basis of payment shall be as per ODOT 253 or 255 as applicable with the following additions:

The unit price shall also include furnishing, installation, maintenance, removal, and disposal of temporary road materials or temporary pavement courses; preparation for permanent pavement courses; and any additional expenses for cold weather protection.

2.11 TYPE "C" PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT (ASPHALT), DRIVEWAY, APRON, OR PARKING LOT

Method of Measurement

The method of measurement shall be as per ODOT 253 or 255 as applicable with the exception that lengths used for calculation of each individual repair area shall not exceed the maximum pay length indicated on the drawings.

Basis of Payment

The basis of payment shall be as per ODOT 253 or 255 as applicable with the following additions:

The unit price shall also include furnishing, installation, maintenance, removal, and disposal of temporary road materials or temporary pavement courses; preparation for permanent pavement courses; backfill and repair of existing sinkhole in the driveway due to the failing sewer, and any additional expenses for cold weather protection for residential driveways.

2.12 6 INCH STORM SEWER LATERAL, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number of downspout and drain laterals to be reconnected to the storm sewer installed per the plans and specifications.

Basis of Payment

The price per each shall include the quantity of reconnected existing downspouts and roof drains to the storm sewer. Price shall include furnishing of all labor, materials, tools necessary to complete the work. The price shall include exploratory excavation, and verification of connections to the existing storm sewer by dye testing; earth and/or rock excavation; sheeting; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess material all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; bedding; compacted granular backfill; compacted backfill material; reconnection of existing piping to the storm sewer, specials; couplings, seals, bends; tees; fittings; riser pipe; jointing material; coring of sewers; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; temporary pavement;

and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.13 PROPOSED STORM CHAMBER, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number installed per the plans and specifications.

Basis of Payment

The price per each shall include the quantity installed of new proposed concrete storm junction chamber. Price shall include the procurement and installation of all the necessary structure castings, lids/covers. Price shall also include providing a shop drawing submittal to the OWNER, with Ohio PE-Stamped structural calculations for engineer's review. Price shall include furnishing of all labor, materials, tools necessary to complete the work. The price shall be irrespective of the depth of the structure and if not called out as a separate pay item shall include;, and verification of other existing utilities and coordination with utility providers for relocation of services prior to installation of the junction chamber; earth and/or rock excavation; sheeting; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess material all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; bedding; compacted granular backfill; compacted backfill material; reconnection of existing storm sewer within the chamber, specials; couplings, seals, bends; tees; fittings; jointing material; coring of sewers; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; removal and replacement of curbing, poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, fences, landscape timbers, guardrails, sign wiring, fixtures, or other appurtenances; temporary pavement; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.14 15" CONDUIT, TYPE C, AS PER PLAN

The work, method of construction and materials for sewer construction shall be in accordance with ODOT Item 611 with the modifications shown on the improvement plans.

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number of linear feet of 15-inch storm sewer conduit, installed per the plans and specifications measured by the plan difference in horizontal distance between the existing sewers, to the connection at the proposed junction chamber.

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall be irrespective of the depth of pipe and if not called out as a separate pay item shall include the furnishing and laying of pipe; field location, couplings to join existing and proposed sewer pipe, exploratory excavation, and verification of other existing utilities prior to laying conduit; earth and/or rock excavation; sheeting; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess

material; connection to proposed junction chamber; all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; bedding; compacted backfill material; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of failed or re-compacted backfill material; specials; bends; tees; fittings; plugs; stoppers; cleanouts; jointing material; dissimilar couplings to join to existing storm sewers; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; connection to existing conduit or structures; leakage testing; internal videotaping; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of pipe failing leakage testing or internal videotaping; removal and replacement of poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, sign wiring, fixtures, or other appurtenances; surface grading; temporary pavement; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.15 36" CONDUIT, TYPE B, AS PER PLAN

The work, method of construction and materials for sewer construction shall be in accordance with ODOT Item 611 with the modifications shown on the improvement plans.

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number of linear feet of 36-inch storm sewer conduit, installed per the plans and specifications measured by the plan difference in horizontal distance between centerlines of manholes and/or inlets; centerline of mainline pipe for transverse sewers or laterals; ends of laterals; between ends of culvert pipe. Any increase in installed length due to change in length of pipe or location of structures not directed by the Engineer shall not be measured for additional payment.

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall be irrespective of the depth of pipe and if not called out as a separate pay item shall include the furnishing and laying of pipe; field location, exploratory excavation, and verification of existing utilities prior to laying conduit; earth and/or rock excavation; sheeting; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess material; connection to proposed junction chamber;; all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; foundation excavation and material as necessary; bedding; compacted backfill material; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of failed or re-compacted backfill material; specials; bends; tees and risers set to grade; access grates; fittings; plugs; stoppers; jointing material; couplings to join to existing RCP storm sewers; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; leakage testing; internal videotaping; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of pipe failing leakage testing or internal videotaping; removal and replacement of poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, sign wiring, fixtures, or other appurtenances; surface grading; temporary pavement; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown. Any increase in installed length due to change in length of pipe or location of structures not directed by the Engineer shall not be measured for additional payment.

2.16 42" CONDUIT, TYPE B, AS PER PLAN

The work, method of construction and materials for sewer construction shall be in accordance with ODOT Item 611 with the modifications shown on the improvement plans.

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number of linear feet of 42-inch storm sewer conduit, installed per the plans and specifications measured by the plan difference in horizontal distance between centerlines of manholes and/or inlets; centerline of mainline pipe for transverse sewers or laterals; ends of laterals; between ends of culvert pipe. Any increase in installed length due to change in length of pipe or location of structures not directed by the Engineer shall not be measured for additional payment.

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall be irrespective of the depth of pipe and if not called out as a separate pay item shall include the furnishing and laying of pipe; field location, exploratory excavation, and verification of existing utilities prior to laying conduit; earth and/or rock excavation; sheeting; shoring; disposal of undesirable and excess material; connection to proposed junction chamber; tees, all pumping required for adequate handling of flow bypassing, underground water and/or surface water; foundation excavation and material as necessary; bedding; compacted backfill material; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of failed or re-compacted backfill material; specials; bends; tees; access grates; fittings; plugs; stoppers; cleanouts; jointing material; protection of existing trees or vegetation to be saved; protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; leakage testing; internal videotaping; Owner's costs related to re-inspection or re-testing of pipe failing leakage testing or internal videotaping; removal and replacement of poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, sign wiring, fixtures, or other appurtenances; surface grading; temporary pavement; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown. Any increase in installed length due to change in length of pipe or location of structures not directed by the Engineer shall not be measured for additional payment.

2.17 JUNCTION CHAMBER, RECONSTRUCTED, AS PER PLAN

Basis of Payment

The quantity to be paid shall be the number installed per the plans and specifications.

Method of Measurement

The quantity to be paid shall be the number installed per the plans and specifications.

The unit price shall include reconstruction of the existing junction chamber wall, located west of Colleen Drive, to provide a sealed connection to the new sewer pipes. Price shall include protection and/or replacement of all existing utilities; poles, posts, signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, fences, or other appurtenances; and the furnishing of all labor, materials, temporary support of the structure

slab, masonry, grouting or sealing methods, tools and appurtenances necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.18 8 INCH WATER MAIN DUCTILE IRON PIPE CL 52, MECHANICAL JOINTS AND FITTINGS, AS PER PLAN

Method of Measurement

The measurement of ductile iron pipe water main of the size and class specified to be paid for shall be the horizontal projected length in feet installed complete, tested and ready for service, including fittings and couplings as approved by Youngstown Water Department, as measured along the centerline of the pipe through fittings from center to center and through valves along with length of 16" diameter schedule 40 steel casing pipe and spacers for the crossing at the storm sewer. No measurement will be made for the required bedding or backfill; payment will be included in the unit price stipulated for water main.

Basis of Payment

The unit price bid shall be full compensation for earth and/or rock excavation for the pipe and foundation for same, including clearing and grubbing, removal and disposal for all materials necessary for placing the pipe, remove and/or transplant existing trees and shrubs, including landscape features such as rocks and timbers as shown on plans; removal and replacement of all signs, mailboxes, paper boxes, fences, guardrails or other structures; furnishing and placing specified bedding, frost proofing, backfill and polywrap: sheeting and shoring to be left in place as shown on plans: furnishing, installing and operating necessary pumps, pipes and appurtenances necessary for flow bypassing and /or trench dewatering; furnishing and installing of the pipe, jointing material, plugs and clamps, tees, bends, megalug joint restraint, concrete; performing testing and disinfection, protection of all other existing utilities including repair if damaged by the contractor; and the furnishing of all labor, tools, materials and equipment necessary to complete the work as specified or as shown.

2.19 LAWN RESTORATION (GRADING, SEEDING, & MULCHING)

Basis of Payment

The unit price shall include furnishing and placement of topsoil, finish grading and regrading of lawn for positive slope towards new storm sewer grates, resetting, and restoring any landscaping disturbed by the work, placing of seed, fertilizers, lime, water, maintenance, mowing, landscaping and all else necessary to establish a grass turf over all disturbed areas to be grassed and restoration of all features disturbed by the installation to equal of better condition than before the beginning of the work.

2.20 ELECTRIC COMPANY CHARGES ALLOWANCE

Basis of Payment

An allowance has been included in the bid proposal to be utilized as directed by the Engineer for direct costs charged by the utility company associated with the de-energizing of existing buried electric line within the work limits, and coordination to remove and reset existing street light pole near water line lowering, and work which can be performed only/exclusively by the utility company. Payment shall be made for only work which has the prior approval of the Engineer.

The Contractor shall be allowed a 5% mark-up on the invoice amount for overhead and profit.

Invoices for all work completed by the utility company(s) or others shall be submitted as evidence of the work completed on the project.

No payment for this item will be made to the Contractor for utility work required when resulting from the Contractor's construction methods or rework due to his negligence or construction methods.

Any portion of the allowance not utilized shall be credited to the Owner.

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1,

2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SA"" identifier indicate that the prevailing wage rate set by a state (or local) government was adopted under 29 C.F.R \clubsuit 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. Me refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 01/03/2024 reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the catter from which the next number adopted the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- an existing published wage determination a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.


